My dear Children

Here we are in

old Liverpool, in ancient Hotel
(recommended to us by Guatteman
from Chicago, I wouldn't select this
but it's clean & comfortable, with
old fashion furniture, oh my! if you
could just follow us around, we
are way back in some of those
old English stories you have
read about, we are in the heart
of city, old very large Art-Bldg
Library ^{near us} - which I would love to
visit on our return this way,
also go out to the suburbs & see

some of the better side of Liverpool
We arrived here about 12.30. but
it took us until 2.0.0. to get thro
Customs & it's wonderful that
Boatplying to & fro like Autos
we took Buss to Hotel, Man carried
Suit Cases to Buss, so Dad hasn't
done any of this. after registering
at Hotel, we walk & walked
window shopping, never saw so
many jewelers stores in my
life. things are much higher than
when we lived here, Diamonds
galore & very reasonable but
of course we wont have money
to spend that way. one thing was
very popular on Boat - the Knitted
suits & they are about \$12 to \$15.
I dont know whether you would
want - me I'll, they looked so
pretty on the girls -

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& the Wool sweaters I only looked
in Windows I saw lovely white slip
on Sweaters (mens) for about \$3.00
& Cashmere shirts cheap - of course
I dont doubt but what they are
cheaper in I don't know, as this city is
full of tourists, from all parts.
& the stores just advertise, shows
windows full of them ladies \$5.00
Mens \$5. Standard shoes, Hats
quite decent - about what we pay
\$3 to \$5 for \$1. Of course this
is only window shopping
The Dept is across St. Ave
leave 9.10. A.M. I imagine
I don't know will look as good to us
as Oregon does after coming from Chicago

It just made our heart-sick to see
the children running the streets. bought
& duty, when I go home will take
a doll & make it look like children
I saw. You never saw a dirty child
yet. A little girl about 11-12.

walk a shawl around her carrying
babies. & their mother at the saloon
oh saloons hours, one for protection
or something like it, where they
cannot get old of the stuff &
The poor children suffer, I can-
not describe it to you now.

after waiting around getting
our ticket & we went to ~~the~~
restaurant - & ate dinner (very
good) come down a peg ~~the~~.

after such service on Boat.
then we hunted for picture show
to relieve the tension, Ah there
we were at Home - fine picture
Conrad Tark, Norma Talmage.

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Story laid in Virginia, the
Coburn also was American picture
too, & it was fine, The Orchestra
very fine. At the Intertitle the
Orchestra play from the Opera
Oberlin very fine, covered 3 times,
ladies don't take of hats, men
I smoke, & girls sell Ice Cream.
Theatre not good like ours -
after that we walked inside
from we are in Parlors of Hotel
Dad is reading, Well we will be
glad to sit at Home dinner
but every ^{thing} was lovely on Boat.
I would like big dish, Cottage
Spinaut ve, Several people were at-

Dock to meet their friends & some
cried for joy. gave us ~~some~~ some
feeling for a minute, I suppose
that's how we will feel when we
arrive home.

There will be much to talk about
when we get home, its 10:30 am
daylight saving time. I wonder

what you all are doing. I hope

you will all have good vacation
& that no one will be hurt.

You pass this letter around to
