We could not have done anything had we been there she was unconscious so did not suffer after the Thursday for a soul. I wish we had been there but I'm glad she did not suffer long this not got her strength up since she was so ill last May she could not understand why not. But the Drs did not think much to her then and was surprised she got about again. Joe was with her when she passed away and he wried us she had gone. He did all he could for us whilst we were there and his wife too she came up everyday to be with us The Nurse and Maid stayed too

to look after things came away when we did because the house was locked up till they came to Value the Furniture etc. We bought all the small things with us but the Furniture was all to be sold.

We gave Joe the writing desk that was in the dining room for all he did for us and he was so glad to have it,

and it will be so useful for him. Yes it is nice to feel that I shall ~~not~~ be dependant on anyone now. If I'm careful

I can enjoy the remainder of my days I've had to work hard all my life with nothing to fall back on. I only wish Auntie had enjoyed more pleasure whilst she was here. I'm glad too that you will not need to worry any more financially just lean on your ears and enjoy the rest of your days in peace and happiness. Now write when you feel inclined. Always glad to hear from you.
