found the water heater in the stove had given  
out. so has to frame up a new one. Geo went

The Plumber had his best working all day nothing

Today has been the most perfect day I ever saw in Feb. We all worked hard all day on the house. The Plumber boy - finished his job, but left some bent faucets and valves. C.V. worked all day on his wiring. Phil got his baggage and a ton of coal. Pettitt brought it out.

The Telephone Co. got the wire to the house and left a Phone but didn't get it connected. George is  $\frac{3}{4}$  sick with a cold. Mamma had a letter from Hazel. I walked up to Woods tonight and got a sack of Pedro Smoking - 10.25 P.M.

Thurs. Feb. 18. 1915. Lovely day.

Very foggy morning. I went down town this morning. got home at 12:15. Went to Public Employment Office 108 main St. waiting on the Board.

I cleaned up the chimney rubbish and saved some old boards sorted and piled the lumber new and old - wrote to F.H. and J.W. in Butte Hotel. Phil & Gus were over tonight - took a mirror over for one of the dresses - I was at Epilepsy Office saw Norman V.V., Patterson, Calcutt.

Worked all day on panels in ceiling. C.V. and I. Electric Inspector came and passed the wiring. The Plumber came and fixed a leak in kitchen ceiling cold water pipe. I sold the Godfrey beer bottles to a junk man, 25<sup>cts</sup> Phoe was over tonight and helped us an hour or so.

I worked hard all day. sheeting in kitchen, and helping C.V. on beams in parlor and dining room. I quit after supper and went down town for a change. the first time this week got meat for Sunday. shoes shined, and tobacco.

Billy came tonight - is stopping at Phoe. I have not seen him. didn't get here till 10<sup>30</sup>. Ray & Jess were at 12. for supper tonight. Ray gave me an ticket I bought him some beef with his mough.

Cleaned the storage room and made more space by arranging the boxes etc! C.V. worked all day in bathroom. Ray painted Music room beams. Geo. Roth and Phoebe at the stove. C.V. went down town tonight - shopping for tomorrow's dinner. The boys working tonight. I am tired.

All are feeling some better tonight. I have not been away from 712 today.
