Thursday June 2. 1910. Seattle. W^m. Very pleasant: cool day.

I went down town this forenoon, after picking the strawberries, and finishing morning chores. Called on Norman but did not stay long. Went down and had my hair cut. Called on Atty. Trefethen in Colman Bldg. he says the City Engineer will be out some time this week to look the damage over on our place. I came home early. I am feeling sick tonight.

Ben. went down town this morning. came home about 5. nothing doing. I bought this book at Rhodes' 10 cent store

I took a quart of strawberries up with me Emma baked me a pie. I came home at 3 P.M. fed chickens exercised Collie and wrote letters. one to Elida. and one to Max K. Walter.

I picked the strawberries this forenoon got $\frac{1}{2}$ gal. I stayed home till the afternoon delivery of Mail. Then went down town saw Mr. Torfitcher, concerning our demand on the City regarding our house. he said we had to present a petition to the City Council. which he was preparing and would mail it to me. I asked him concerning his charge for representing us. asked him if he would do it on percentage. he said he had never done anything that way. but his fee would not be much. he is to send me statement soon what it will be. Ben. went down town this morning to try and find something to do. Called up about 8.³⁰ tonight and said he had to see a party before coming home, but would be home soon.

We made memorandum of 3 two flat buildings to look up for listing. I came home by Star Grocery. got some Condensed Milk and green onions. Ben. went down town this morning. was home ahead of me. he is over to Becks. in Niftakers house tonight - playing cards. I had to pen up 2 setting hens tonight.

I and Ben left the house at same time. he to go to Winton Garage and I for down town. I deposited Clarence's Check for \$50.⁰⁰ went to Normans Office. he is trying to get a satisfactory listing for Burns. but as yet we have not. Ben and I came home at same time. I watered the lawn, flowers and fruit this evening fearing the rain would not be sufficient

Gasoline we are now using gasoline stove to make our Coffee etc. I went down town. Paid Star Grocery \$15.⁰⁰ on acct. got \$5.⁰⁰ change. so could fit Ben out to get gasoline. I then went down town. Norman & I eat at Jones' Coffee House. We went to see Mr. Burns and tell him we were working. Norman bought a pair of Pat Leather shoes of him. ^{2.12} Ben beat me home. I was home about 5. we stayed home.
