NOTE TO CLERK OF COURT.—On and after une 29, 1911, clerks of courts should refuse to execute petitions for allens who have arrived in the United State after June 29, 1906, until the certificate of arrival s furnished the clerk after request of the alien on Form 2226.  NOTE.—A copy of this form (Form 2214) should be furnished by the clerk of the court to each applicant for a petition for naturalization who arrived in this country on or before June 29, 1906, so that he can at his leisure fill in the answers to the questions.
