10 miles North of Ocean Park and came back Had  
a slug of coffee, Bacon, Eggs & Beans - Cleaned  
few Clams - 4 hours - and went to Ilwaco  
for few incidentals - Spent ten byers  
almost before I even got a beer - Donna  
stay away from that place - Just gave  
Marie ~~these~~ for using up so much space  
in this book, In turning out to be  
worse - She just <sup>let me</sup> ~~not~~ too potibly) when  
I could go - We gathered a bunch of woods  
at Ilwaco also a quart of Berries which  
look delicious - My right arm could be  
missing but it would not be more  
~~missed~~ <sup>missed</sup> than Lil at the Beach -

errand in trees - Love you folks
